MSMEs are the backbone of our economy, constituting a significant portion of employment and contributing to our Gross Domestic Product (GDP). Recognizing this, we seek to implement comprehensive reform initiatives to empower and uplift these enterprises, providing them with the necessary support, resources, and environment to flourish. By doing so, we aim to unleash innovation, enhance productivity, and create a more inclusive economy.

In the global landscape, export competitiveness is indispensable for Belize's economic resilience. Our government is dedicated to assisting in the enhancing of products' quality, and facilitating trade to ensure that our goods and services can compete effectively in the international stage. Strengthening our export capabilities will stimulate our economic growth and can position Belize as a key player in the regional and global markets.

Moreover, strategic investments, both national and international are pivotal for unlocking avenues of economic growth. By fostering an environment conducive to investment, we aim to attract capital inflows, and spur innovation across various sectors. These investments are not merely financial transactions, they represent a shared commitment to the prosperity of Belize.

The Government of Belize remains resolute in its commitment to MSME development, export c ompetitiveness, and strategic investment as integral components of our economic vision. By prioritizing the BIBCAP's 9 key policy pillars, we are poised to unlock unprecedented opportunities, drive sustainable growth, and secure a prosperous future for all Belizeans.



Overview

The Government of Belize (GOB) is fully committed to establishing Belize's position as an important economic player in the region. In this regard, the country has embarked on several reforms intended to facilitate private domestic and foreign investment in several different domains with the overarching vision to, "position Belize as a competitive, robust and favorite investment hub in the Central America and Caribbean Region by 2030".

To align various complementary strategies including the National Investment Policy and Strategy (NIPS), the MSME Strategy and Roadmap, and the Export Competitiveness Roadmap (ECR), the Government of Belize has merged the implementation efforts of these strategies and all respective activities under a single Action Plan - the Belize Investment and Business Climate Action Plan (BIBCAP).

This merged approach enables efforts to be better coordinated and directed for increased efficiency and the maximizing of resources. The areas of focus are based on specific key policy pillars that aim at improving the business and investment climate in Belize and significantly impact the facilitation of domestic and foreign investment, MSME growth and development, enhanced innovation, and improved and sustained competitiveness.

BIBCAP is a comprehensive and cohesive guide that outlines nine (9) key Policy Pillars and includes a detailed plan listing specific tasks to be completed under each pillar with which to guide the implementation.

These actions are planned to be implemented over a period of 6 years (2024-2029) through established Technical Working Groups (TWGs).


